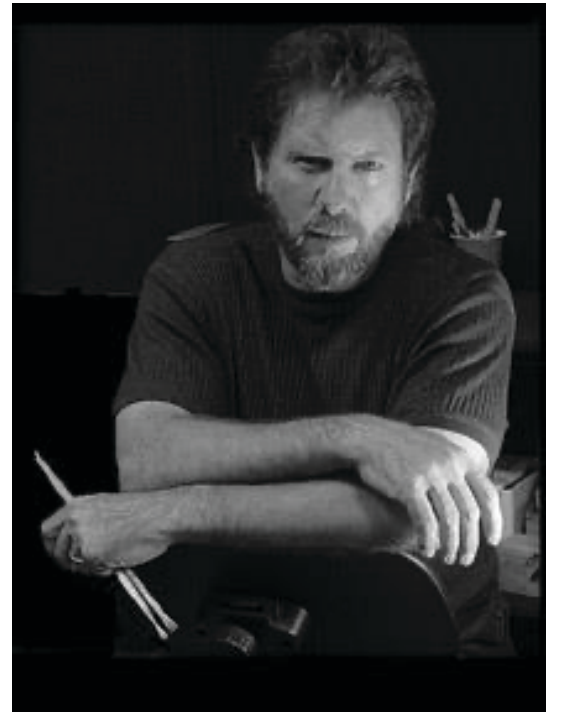

FEATURED ARTIST PATRICK J. REYNOLDS

I have a saying that you can never choose art, it chooses you! Well in the case of my medium, it definitely chose me. The day that changed my life forever, was at an art event in New Orleans where I was doing a demonstration using a piece that I had been working on for weeks. Sitting at a large art table describing how I use the tools of the trade by doing tiny finishing touches, I reached across the table for my large cup of New Orleans blend deep roast coffee and Swish! my hand slipped, and drenched my 30x40 graphite drawing! So in a panic, I stood up and flung the coffee off the piece and into the crowd! They bursted into applause at how Theatrical I finished the piece with coffee and such a command for the medium!



Within seconds, a bidding war started, who would be the proud owner of this sepia toned coffee painting! Little did they know, they would be the first.

I since attempted to purchase the piece back, but to no avail, as they informed me that there is no amount of money that could currently purchase it.

Things have definitely evolved since then, as I was invited to teach different art techniques throughout Europe, not expecting that I would be the one learning. Once again, I found myself immersed in a world of real artists, the kind that paint from the soul, the kind that would rather paint than eat! It moves me to this day when I think of the old timer artists who try to convey how to capture a feeling in your mind and record it on canvas for others to feel for centuries. The techniques haven't really changed much since Rembrandt, such as the use of boiled linseed oils and palette knife, but I felt that I had stumbled upon a part of myself that I would not have realized if I had never been exposed to speaking to these old timer Italian masters. I was finally in my element, still drawing away with my graphite block but finishing it off with layers and layers of different types of boiled linseed oils and natural oxidizers that make the pieces last literally for centuries.

Of course the main body of my work is figurative, it is actually story telling by nature. For instance a piece that has ribbons flowing down represents life itself embracing us, but sometimes the ribbon is tattered and torn, saying the life sometimes is not always happy and shiny, but we need those rough times to make us grow. And the base of many of my figures are on rocks insinuating that we must all find a solid foundation in life to base all of our decisions, because if you stand for nothing, you will fall for anything.

JUDITH POWERS



Judith Powers served 21 years as the executive director of the Pinellas County Arts Council and the Cultural Affairs Department and 12 years as the director of the Florida Gulf Coast Art Center in Belleair. She served as a board member and president of the Florida Association of Local Arts Agencies and has been active with a number of community organizations including the Junior League of Clearwater-Dunedin, the PACE Center for Girls, the Pinellas Community Foundation and the Pinellas County Historical Society. She has served on both the Clearwater and St. Petersburg Public Arts Commissions, the St. Petersburg Arts Alliance and currently serves on the City of St. Petersburg Arts Advisory Committee.

She holds an MA & MFA from the University of South Florida and is a working artist with a studio in St. Petersburg. Her work is several collections including the Florida State House of Representatives, City of Orlando, Winter Park, Pensacola Community College, and the Polk

Museum of Art. She has participated in numerous gallery and museum exhibitions and for several years was an active participant in outdoor festivals, winning best in show awards at Gasparilla, Mainsail, Art Harvest in Dunedin, Gainesville, St. Augustine, Pensacola and many others.

AMANDA POSS



Amanda Poss is the Gallery Director for Hillsborough Community College (2017-present), where she directs and implements visual arts programming across multiple HCC campuses.

In addition to curating gallery exhibitions, Poss expanded access to the arts by instituting the college's first public art program in 2018 (Grounds4Art@HCC) and by growing the Permanent Art Collection, which has tripled in size during her tenure. In 2019, she completed a Fulbright-Hays GPA program in Brazil focusing on representations of the Afro-Brazilian Diaspora in the arts.

Poss teaches as an Adjunct Professor at HCC (2015-present) and serves as a Board Member for Tempus Projects in Tampa, FL (2020-present). She received her MA in Art History from the University of South Florida in 2015 specializing in Modern and Contemporary Art, and a BA from the University of Saint Francis, Fort Wayne, Indiana in 2011.

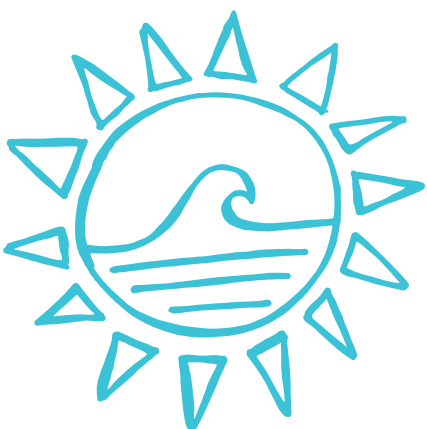

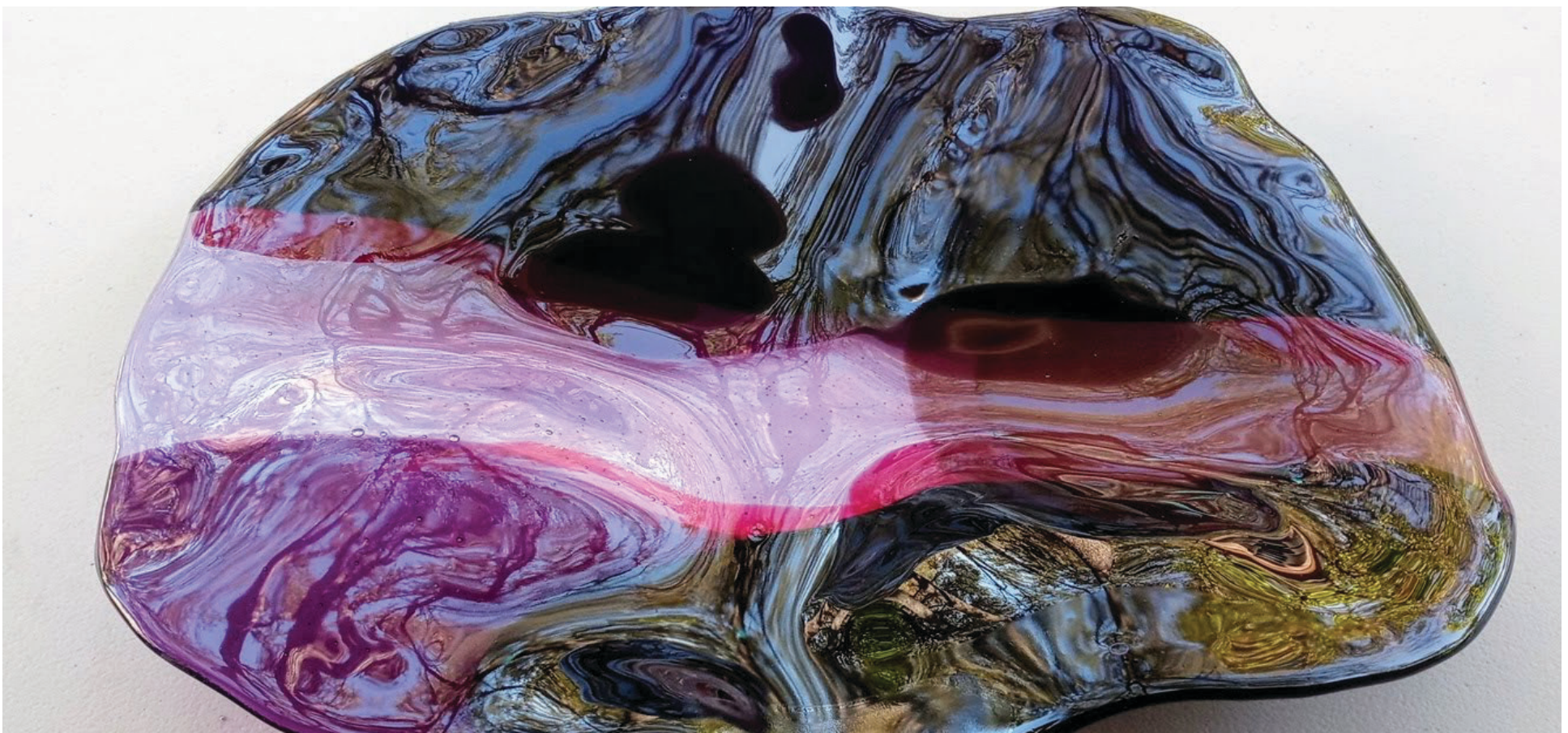

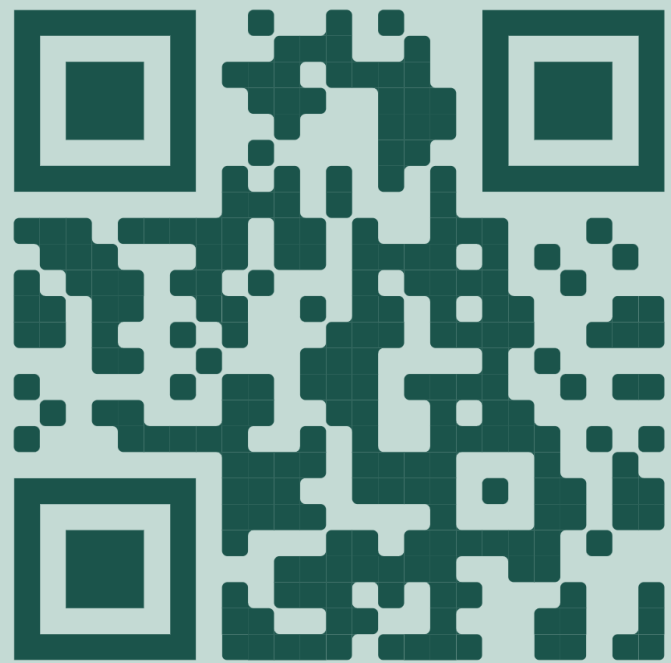
