Current Community Focus: Fighting Poverty in Northern Pinellas

The Junior League of Clearwater-Dunedin currently provides 60 food insecure children with food every week through our Pack-A-Snack program, so that those children have meals over the weekend.

JLCD also donated 800 books last year to children and we provide special meals and treats throughout the year with our Holiday Relief program to bring normalcy to local families.

Last year, JLCD provided \$2,000 in grants and personnel support to projects with local non-profits that fall within our current focus area. Members also advocate, along with 11,000 other Junior League women in the state, for legislation changes that support women and children.

Featured Artist Leslie Peebles



My path as an artist intertwines between spiritual, dream work, and an ever growing connection with nature. Nature serves as a living metaphor for the connectedness of all things; internal, external and universal. Land, trees and animals are projections and identifiers of self and universe.

Pieces begin with a profound personal experience. The long, arduous process of carving becomes a meditation on that experience and the intrinsic beauty of the relief print amplifies the subject through energetic and radiant

line work. The blocks are printed on an etching press and color is added with watercolor, encaustic medium, or through reduction and/or multi-block printmaking.

My degree is in drawing and painting. Drawing is a big part of the printmaking process, but I am also a painter. Painting is immediate, sensuous and direct, and connects me to my subject in a different way. Encaustics are the second oldest painting medium known to humans. They are beeswax, damar resin (which hardens the wax), and pigment. Painting and printmaking feed me in different ways; and they also feed and compliment each other. The merging of the two mediums is a vigorous blend of meditative energy and delicate immediacy.

Leslie Peebles was born in Hackensack, New Jersey in 1959, lived in the suburbs of New York City until 1971 when she and her family moved to Suwannee County, Florida where her father became a Broiler Chicken Producer for Gold Kist. Living on the 80 acre farm near the Suwannee River fostered a deep love, respect and fascination for nature.

Leslie attended The University of the South in Sewanee Tennessee and received her B.A. in Studio Art from Newcomb College in New Orleans in 1981. Leslie moved to Gainesville in 1985 and received an M.A. in Art Education from U.F. in 1994. She taught Art for 17 years in Florida.

Leslie has won numerous awards including First place from Coconut Grove, Tallahassee, Mount Dora, and the Morse Museum Award from Winter Park and Best of Show at Three Rivers in Pittsburg and Atalaya in South Carolina.. She is currently represented by McIntyre Studios in Gainesville, High Tides Gallery in St. Augustine, Clay and Paper Gallery in Dunedin, and Art Expo Gallery in St. Petersburg Beach, and Clyde Butcher's Big Cypress Gallery.

AMANDA POSS

Amanda Poss received her MA in Art History from the University of South Florida in 2015 specializing in Modern and Contemporary Art and a BA from the University of Saint Francis, Fort Wayne, Indiana in 2011. Poss is the Gallery Director at Gallery221@HCC Dale Mabry Campus where she has curated 10-12 exhibitions per year, with complementary educational programming, since 2017. Poss instituted the college's first public art program in 2018, Grounds4Art@HCC, and oversees the Permanent Art Collection, which has doubled in size during her tenure. She is the former Gallery Director at Blake High School (2015-17), and has held positions at the Scarfone/Hartley Gallery as a Gallery Assistant, Adjunct Professor at the University of Tampa, and Adjunct Professor at Hillsborough Community College. Poss has served as juror for multiple art competitions in the region, including the Scholastic Regional Art and Writing Competition, the 33rd Annual Melbourne Art Festival, PAVA Annual Members Show, and the 45th Annual Temple Terrace Arts and Crafts Festival, among others.



JUDITH POWERS



Judith Powers served 21 years as the executive director of the Pinellas County Arts Council and the Cultural Affairs Department and 12 years as the director of the Florida Gulf Coast Art Center in Belleair. She served as a board member and president of the Florida Association of Local Arts Agencies and has been active with a number of community organizations including the Junior League of Clearwater-Dunedin, the PACE Center for Girls and the Pinellas County Historical Society. She has served on both the Clearwater and St. Petersburg Public Arts Commissions, the St. Petersburg Arts Alliance and currently serves on the City of St. Petersburg Arts Advisory Committee and the board of the Pinellas Community Foundation. She holds an MA & MFA from the University of South Florida and is a working artist with a studio in St. Petersburg. Her work is several collections including the Florida State House of Representatives, City of Orlando, Winter Park, Pensacola Community College, and the Polk Museum of Art. She has participated in numerous gallery and museum exhibitions and for several years was an active participant in outdoor festivals....winning best in show awards at Gasparilla, Mainsail, Art Harvest in Dunedin, Gainesville, St. Augustine, Pensacola and many others.

REBECCA SEXTON LARSON

Rebecca Sexton Larson is a Tampa based studio artist and museum curator. She graduated from the University of South Florida with degrees in both Fine Arts and Mass Communications.

During the past two decades, Rebecca Sexton Larson has taught, lectured, exhibited, and curated at various arts institutions and organizations. Her most recent position was that of chief curator at Maitland's

Art & History Museums. Sexton Larson's museum experience includes The Tampa Museum of Art (curatorial and educational), the Polk Museum of Art in Lakeland (Education Curator) and the Leepa-Rattner Museum of Art (Associate Curator/Registrar).

Sexton Larson has been awarded three Florida Individual Artist Fellowships (1998, 2002, and 2008). In 2006, she received an Artist Enhancement Grant from the State of Florida and, in 2005, was commissioned by the City of Tampa as its Photographer Laureate for a year. As Photo Laureate, she documented from her perspective the visual poetry of Tampa using a standard pinhole camera combined with hand-painting b/w photographs.

In 2015 Sexton Larson received a grant from the State of Florida to attend the prestigious Creative Capital Professional Development Program that supports innovative artists across the country through funding, counsel, and career development services.

Sexton Larson's photographs are in numerous significant collections throughout the country, including: Polaroid; Progressive Corporate Art; Graham Nash (Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young); Polk Museum of Art (Lakeland); Museum of Fine Arts (St. Petersburg); the Tampa Museum of Art (Tampa); Historical Museum (Santa Fe); and Candela Gallery (Richmond). Many of her one-of-a-kind works are in private collections.

Larson's photographs are featured in photographic periodicals including View Camera Magazine, Black and White Magazine, Silvershotz, Adore Noir Magazine, Afterimage, and others.
